## AN ORDINANCE: FIXING THE TAX RATE FOR ALL CITY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 2014

THE CITY OF EASTON HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. A tax rate of 24.95 Mill on each dollar of assessed valuation, provided such valuation is fixed at a rate of 50% of market value as established by the Northampton County Assessment Office, be and the same is hereby levied on all persons and property within the said City subject to taxation for City purposes for the year 2014 as follows:

SECTION 2. A residence tax for general revenue purposes of the City be and is hereby levied on all inhabitants above the age of eighteen (18) years in the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be, and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective January 1, 2014
