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AN ORDINANCE: Amending Sections in Chapter 560, Vehicles and Traffic, of the Code of the City of Easton, Pa.

THE CITY OF EASTON HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Section 560-10 B 1, be and it is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (1) If any motor vehicle/conveyance is illegally parked in violation of this Code or any applicable provision of the Motor Vehicle code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or whose owner is delinquent in payment of fines and costs imposed by a District Magistrate and for whom a warrant of arrest has been issued by a District Magistrate or whose owner is delinquent in payment of fines and penalties as a result of the owner's vehicle being in violation of the parking laws of the City of Easton or the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, then that owner's vehicle(s)/conveyance(s) shall be prohibited from parking on City streets and may be removed, impounded or immobilized.

SECTION 2. Section 560-10 B 4, be and it is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (4) **Upon notification of the accumulation of ten (10) unpaid Parking Tickets, the immobilization process shall be implemented.** Upon immobilization, a Certified Letter will be sent to the last registered owner informing him/her of the reason for the immobilization and the process for release of the vehicle. **The last registered owner of the vehicle who, upon receipt of the Certified Letter, will have seven (7) business days to respond to the Easton Police department Traffic Division to pay full compensation of any fines, costs and penalties. If no response, from the last registered owner, is received by the Easton Police Department within the required time, the Police Department shall institute actions against the vehicle/owner for abandonment of the vehicle on public or private property.** Vehicles not released within three days of the date of immobilization will accrue towing and storage charges in addition to any other accrued fees and penalties.

SECTION 3. All Ordinance or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days following adoption by Council.

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AN ORDINANCE: Deleting Sub-Section 399-21 B. Section 399-21, Violations and penalties, of Chapter 399, Parking Permits, of the Code of the City of Easton, Pa.

THE CITY OF EASTON HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Sub-Section 399-21 B, be and it is hereby deleted in its entirety.

~~B. Vehicles with three or more unpaid tickets, of which at least two of those tickets are over 10 days old, may be immobilized (the boot). Vehicles which are immobilized will be assessed a fee, as specified in Chapter 285, Fees; this fee plus satisfaction of all unpaid penalties will be required before their release. Upon immobilization, a certified letter will be sent to the last registered owner informing him/her of the reason for the immobilization, and the process for release of the vehicle. Vehicles not released within three days of immobilization will be towed to a storage facility of the City's choice and will accrue towing and storage charges in addition to any other accrued fees and penalties.~~

SECTION 2 All Ordinance or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall become 30 days following adoption by Council.
