## Recycling Information

### Recycling... It's the law.

Recycling pickup service for each household will be every other week.

Place these items in your Blue Recycle Can:

- Aluminum cans (beer & soda)
- Aluminum foil & foil plates, etc. (clean)
- Glass bottles & jars (food & drink only)
- Plastic bottles, jars, tubs and buckets (soda, water, juice) – no plastic bags.
- All plastic food and beverage containers labeled #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, and #7. Note that #6 is not acceptable
- Metal food cans (tin/steel); metal lids
- Metal pots and pans



Recycle cans are available for \$5 at Easton City Hall and the Recycling Center.

Place these items in your Second Blue Recycle Can:

- Paper—dry & clean (not in plastic bags)
- Newspaper & inserts
- Magazines & catalogs
- Junk mail, envelopes, file folders
- Office white, colored and computer paper (staples & paper clips ok)
- Corrugated cardboard boxes
- Cereal & gift boxes, etc. that tear brown or grey (remove bag liners)
- Paper bags & phone books
- Wrapping paper (remove metallic paper, bows etc.)

### Unacceptable Materials:

- Ceramics, dishes, coffee cups, drinking glasses, window glass, mirrors, light bulbs
- Glass cookware/bakeware (Pyrex, Vision Ware, etc.)
- Plastic bags, styrofoam containers, styrofoam packaging, or packaging peanuts
- Take out containers, plastic cups, plastic tableware
- Containers of hazardous or toxic materials
- Tissues or paper towels
- Bound books
- Paper cartons for milk or juice (gable-top cartons) or wax coated boxes
- Household appliances or toys
- Coat hangers
- Food waste, garbage
- **No Styrofoam Products or Plastic Bags are Acceptable**

### Holiday Reschedules:

Holidays change your pickup day—PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.

If one of 5 major holidays falls on your pickup day, then your pickup day with ALL REMAINING COLLECTIONS THAT WEEK will be one day later.

The July 4 holiday falls on a Saturday and will not affect the regular schedule.

#### Your Pickup Day

- New Year's Day (Jan. 1) ..... Jan. 2
- Memorial Day (May 25) ..... May 26
- Labor Day (Sept. 7) ..... Sept. 8
- Thanksgiving Day (Nov. 26) .. Nov. 27
- Christmas Day (Dec. 25) ..... Dec. 26


# Garbage Preparation and Pickup Information

Please locate your residential area on this map.

Colors indicate which day of the week your pickup will be.




For example: the green solid and striped sector have Monday pickup, the yellow solid and striped areas have Tuesday pickup, and so on.



If your property is in a SOLID color sector, you are considered Zone A for recycling pickup. Please see reverse side for your exact pickup dates.



If your property is in a STRIPED color sector, you are considered Zone B for recycling pickup. Please see reverse side for your exact pickup dates.



**Important Requirements:**

■ **4 CONTAINERS (Or Equivalent) PER WEEK LIMIT.**

Each household is limited to four (4) 32-gallon containers or the equivalent volume each week. Construction debris may also be substituted for one can per week and is limited to the following: drywall, plaster, lath, roofing shingles and lumber – cut down to maximum length of three (3) feet. Yard waste may also be substituted but will be counted as part of your limit. No single bag or container may weigh more than forty (40) pounds.

■ **1 BULK ITEM PER WEEK LIMIT.**

Households are limited to one (1) bulk item per week. Bulk items typically will include:

- Sofa or Large Furniture
- Mattress
- Carpet or Rugs
- Refrigerator\*
- Air Conditioner\*
- Stove
- Water Heater
- Washing Machine or Dryer
- Water Cooler\*
- Freezer\*

*\* ALL BULK ITEMS WITH REFRIGERATION must be certified as Deactivated Free of Chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) and Hydrofluorocarbons (HCFCs) as required under Section 608 of the E.P.A. Clean Air Act.*



■ **BRUSH & YARD WASTE**

Brush and yard waste may be dropped off at the city recycling center, located at 500 Bushkill Drive, between the hours of 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday. Seasonal evening pickup may also be available by calling 610-250-6680.
